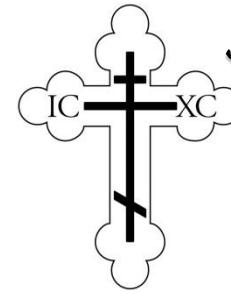

The Circumcision of Our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ

The eighth day following His birth, the Divine Child was presented in the Temple and circumcised according to the Law existing in Israel since the time of Abraham. On this occasion, He was given the name Jesus, which the Archangel Gabriel announced to the All-Holy Virgin Mary. The Old Testament circumcision was the proto-type of the New Testament baptism. The circumcision of our Lord shows that He received upon Himself the true body of man and not just seemingly, as was later taught of Him by heretics. Our Lord was also circumcised because He wanted to fulfill the entire Law which He Himself gave through the prophets and forefathers. In fulfilling the written Law, He replaced it with Baptism in His Holy Church as was proclaimed by the Apostle Paul: "For neither does circumcision mean anything, nor does uncircumcision, but only a new creation" (Galatians 6:15). (In the cycle of the liturgical calendar of the Church, this Feast of the Lord's Circumcision has neither a Forefeast nor an Antefeast).

St Basil the Great, Archbishop of Caesarea

Basil was born during the reign of Emperor Constantine. While still unbaptized, Basil spent fifteen years in Athens where he studied philosophy, rhetoric, astronomy and all other secular sciences of that time. His colleagues at that time were Gregory the Theologian and Julian, later the apostate emperor. In his mature years he was baptized in the river Jordan along with Euvlios his former teacher. He was Bishop of Caesarea in Cappadocia for almost ten years and completed his earthly life fifty years after his birth. He was a great defender of Orthodoxy, a great light of moral purity, a religious zealot, a great theological mind, a great builder and pillar of the Church of God. Basil fully deserved the title "Great." In liturgical services, he is referred to as the "bee of the Church of Christ which brings honey to the faithful and with its stinger pricks the heretics." Numerous works of this Father of the Church are preserved; they include theological, apologetical, ascetical and canonical writings as well as the Holy and Divine Liturgy named after him. This Divine Liturgy is celebrated ten times throughout the year: the First of January, his feast day; on the eve of the Nativity of our Lord; on the eve of the Theophany of our Lord; all Sundays of the Honorable Fast [Lenten Season], except Palm Sunday; on Great and Holy Thursday and on Great and Holy Saturday. St. Basil died peacefully on January 1, 379 A.D., and was translated into the Kingdom of Christ.

Troparion – Tone 3 (Sunday)

Let the heavens rejoice! / Let the earth be glad! /
For the Lord has *shown* strength with his arm! /
He has trampled down death by death! /
He has become the first-born of the dead! /
He has delivered us *from* the depths of hell, /
And has granted to the world /// Great mercy!

Troparion – Tone 1 (Circumcision)

Seated upon a fiery throne in the heavens /
Together with the pre-eternal Father and the Holy Spirit, /
Thou wast pleased to be born on earth of a Mother /
A Maiden who knew not wedlock. /
Therefore, thou hast been circumcised on the eighth day like a man. /
Glory to Thine all-glorious counsel; /
Glory to Thy dispensation; ///
Glory to Thy condescension, O only Lover of mankind!

Troparion – Tone 1 (St. Basil)

Thy voice hath gone out into all the world /
And thy word hath been received.
Thou didst teach divinely concerning the nature of things /
And thou hast adorned the ways of mankind. /
O father Basil, of the royal priesthood, ///
Entreat Christ God that our souls may be saved.

Kontakion – Tone 4 (St. Basil)

Thou didst become an unshakeable pillar of the Church, /
A harbor and refuge / Distributing to all mankind thy teachings /
O venerable father Basil, /// Who dost reveal mysteries of heaven.

Kontakion – Tone 3 (Circumcision)

The Lord of all endures circumcision; /
His [flesh is being cut] for the sins of mankind, /
For He is good and grants salvation to the world /
While Basil, the Creator's high-priest is clothed with light, ///
As he rejoices *in* the heavens.
